REGISTER FOR MASS

Please register for Mass before Thursday at noon prior to Sunday Mass. We are only permitted to have 30% occupancy during Masses. For St. Aloysius this is forty people – for Our Lady Queen of Peace this is seventy people. We need you to phone or email the office to pre-register for Mass. Also, there is an option of indicating on the sign-in sheet at Mass that you will be there next week. This will allow us to reserve a seat for you and any guests you may be bringing.

If you do not register for Mass there is a possibility that you may be turned away if the church has already reached its occupancy (occupancy numbers include those present in the church and also those who pre-registered). If you have registered for Mass and find that you are unable to attend Mass please contact us as soon as possible and this may potentially ‘free up’ a seat for another parishioner.



Since we reopened there was only one occasion that we went beyond the 30% seating capacity, and that was the long weekend of this month in August. We have a capacity of 48 people that came to mass that day in our church of St. Aloysius.

I thank you so much for pre-registering for mass. It’s not just to give us an accurate head count of people who are coming to mass, but it is a key strategy for preventing further spread of COVID-19 (contact tracing).

From the Desk of the Pastor...

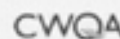

Dear Parents of Children in Grade Two,

It is with great joy that St. Aloysius & Our Lady Queen of Peace Parishes welcome children in grades two or above to prepare for the Sacraments of **First Reconciliation** and **First Holy Communion**. At school, children study the background and foundation of these Sacraments. At home, parents reveal how these Sacraments are lived out daily, fulfilling the promise made at their child's baptism to raise their child in the practice of the faith.

This year, preparation from the church will look a bit different as most will be done at home at whatever pace parents choose using two workbooks and some accompanying videos. There are no due dates, pressure or in-person sessions. At thirty minutes a week, typically children can be prepared to receive their First Reconciliation in eight weeks and their First Communion in another ten. **It's also never too late to sign a child up to prepare.** This process can begin at whatever time is most convenient for families. During the pandemic, parents may opt to defer preparing a child for these Sacraments until a more opportune, safe or comfortable time.

Families living within the boundaries of or registered and worshipping at our parish are welcome to enrol their children in the sacramental preparation program. For a serious reason, a candidate who lives or worships at another parish may receive these Sacraments here with a letter of permission from their parish pastor.

Families of children baptized at another parish will need to provide a copy their child's baptismal certificate. Certificates can be obtained from the parish where he/she was baptized. Additionally, we ask each family to offer \$50 to cover the cost of the workbooks that will be given.

Please contact the parish office if you would like to proceed with this Sacramental preparation, and we will provide a list of important dates and times as well a checklist of steps to take leading up to your child's First Reconciliation and First Communion. Like you, we too wish for your child to receive these Sacraments and are willing to walk with you through any challenges that may arise. Families who encounter obstacles are encouraged to contact the church as soon as possible so that alternate arrangements can be made. Such obstacles may include: not having access to the internet, the need for extra assistance or adaptations, belonging to another parish or your child has been baptized in a non-Catholic church or has not been baptized at all.

We pray and hope that, through this preparation process, this time in your family's and child's life will not simply be a ritual but a period of true faith growth.

Face Mask Q&A From Bishop Meihm

What happens if someone says they have a medical reason or a cultural/religious reason for not wearing the face covering? *Welcome them to the parish and seat them in a pew maintaining 6 feet/2 metres of physical distance.*

Is a face covering the same as a face mask?

“A face covering means a medical or non-medical mask or other face covering such as a bandana or scarf that covers the mouth and nose.”

What happens if someone says they don't like face coverings/masks and then they change their reason to a medical reason or a cultural/religious reason for not wearing the face covering? *Welcome them to the parish and seat them in a pew maintaining 6 feet/2 metres of physical distance.*

Can I give someone a disposable face mask or covering if they don't have one? *Yes, please do. Parishes and Missions in the HKPR District Health Unit jurisdiction will need to have an ample supply of face coverings so that those who forgot their face covering can enter the parish.*

What if I don't think the face covering is sufficient? *As long as the mouth and nose are covered, welcome them to the parish and seat them in a pew maintaining 6 feet/2 metres of physical distance.*

When do I refuse entry to the parish? *It is the responsibility of the priest to refuse entry if he deems that there is no possible resolution to the matter having offered a face covering/mask or not having heard a reason for exemption.*
