Second Sunday of Advent

From the desk of the pastor...

It's Second Sunday of Advent! Time flies so fast!

Bishop Clarke once told this anecdote about **Growing crabs "molt" every so often as they** grow. What this means is that crabs shed their outer shell, which does not grow, to make room for a new shell more conducive to housing their growing body. And they need lots of "moisture" to avoid death and to make the process less painful. This "self-shedding of the old" is doing "radical violence" to what we call the crab's body. But it is necessary in order to avoid death from suffocation in his "old" lifestyle. In the spiritual level St. Paul is saying that (in effect) we, too, must make "every effort to be found without stain or defilement" when the Lord comes again. Notice that it calls for effort on our part; we don't just waltz our way into heaven - it takes work, albeit joyful work. We need to shed our old "shells" of selfishness and pride, as well as our disobedience to the teachings of the Church in matters of faith and morals (such disobedience is also sinful and stubborn pride, is it not?). St. Paul is warning us not to be caught wrapped in a useless shell of cultural conformity that prevents spiritual growth. Continued spiritual growth is an absolutely essential part of our preparation for eternity; it is our way of "preparing the way of the Lord" who will come again at a time unknown to us, without warning. We need the "moisture" of prayer, humility and trustful obedience to the Church to avoid eternal death.

On this Second Sunday of Advent, God is offering us a new future. Let us choose it, turn away from the past, and accept what God is offering us.

ANNOUNCEMENT BEFORE/AT MASS

Welcome to the celebration of Mass at our parish!

We are working to look after each other's safety and good health during these days of the pandemic. It is our hope that working together, we can stop the spread of this virus and join together in prayer safely.

This Announcement is a reminder for all of us. It remains critically important for each of us to continue following the health precautions. This includes:

staying home when ill, even with mild symptoms;

• practising physical distancing of 2 metres or 6 feet with those outside your household or social circle:

- protecting your social circle;
- wearing a face covering/mask;
- washing your hands frequently and thoroughly; and
- adhering to gathering limits and rules.

The O. Reg 364/20 became law in the Province of Ontario on October 2, 2020.

Everyone attending the place of worship (church), must wear a face covering the entire time that they are indoors - this includes the celebrant, deacon, and liturgical ministers.

If a person has a health concern related to the wearing of the face mask, the law provides a provision for this exemption to be respected. This time of uncertainty calls each one of us to renew and amplify our Christian commitment to prayer, reflection, prudent care of each other, and helping others. Let us continue to pray for those who have died, those who are ill, those who work on the front lines and serve our community, and the ongoing work of medical researchers to discover a vaccine and a cure.
