


From the desk of the pastor...

The Lenten Season and Ash Wednesday quickly approach. Here are just a few reminders and points of note:

- 1. The time of Lent was originally established by the Church as a preparation for Baptism which took place during the celebration of the Easter Vigil. Eventually, it became a period of repentance of sin for all the faithful in preparation for Easter.
- 2. The time of preparation for Easter, at first, lasted three weeks, which corresponded to our 3rd, 4th, and 5th weeks of Lent. Later, two more weeks were added: our present 1st and 2nd weeks of Lent. And much later, four days more were added, pushing back the beginning of Lent to Ash Wednesday as at present. This was done to complete the 40 days of fast since the fasting was interrupted on Sundays.
- 3. The yearly commemoration of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ has been observed in the Church since the earliest times. Originally, the commemoration lasted three days: Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Eventually it was extended to a whole week, what is now called Holy Week, which has its culmination in the "Sacred triduum" – Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday.
- 4. For a long time, fast and abstinence were considered as among the best ways of doing penance. They are still useful, but since circumstances in the world have greatly changed, **the Church does not impose them any longer as a command, except on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.** She invites her children to choose ways of doing penance which are best suited to their own condition.

<u>Update to</u> Lockdown Measures



Premier Doug Ford has declared a second provincial emergency which went into effect yesterday and the Premier has also issued a Stay-at-Home Order which went into effect on Thursday, January 14, 2021, at 12:01 a.m. The State of Provincial Emergency and the Stay-at-Home Order will remain in effect until February 10, 2021.

Here is a summary of the implications of the State of Emergency and the Stay-at-Home Order for churches.

- The limit for the celebration of Daily Mass, Weddings, and Funerals is **10 including the celebrant and liturgical ministers**.
- No gatherings for meetings or organizations will take place in the parish hall.
- All health precautions previously issued remain in force:
 - Limit of 10 people including the priest and all liturgical ministers
 - Sanitation and hygiene practices at the church
 - Signage for entrances, exits, use of hand sanitizers, physical distancing, wearing face masks, etc.
 - Distinct doorways for entering and exiting
 - \circ $\,$ No public celebration of Sunday Masses at this time.
 - Permission has been given for the priest to celebrate a public Daily Mass if he determines that all the health precautions can be put in place.
 - Clear procedures for the distribution of Holy Communion
 - Face masks are always required in places of worship (this includes the celebrant) and worksites in the province of Ontario.


The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes and it is a time to pray for those who are ill and for those who serve in the health ministry.
