



From the Desk of the Pastor...



My kingdom does not belong to this world. We usually think of a king as one who rules a kingdom, has a throne, wields a sceptre of power, and lives in a castle. He is protected and defended by his subjects. They bow to him, submit themselves to him and fight to death for him. A king is known to be rich and powerful and has authority of life and death over his subjects.

Jesus is a different kind of king. His throne is the cross. He rules by serving us. His power is his merciful and redeeming love overcoming sin and death. He is the Good Shepherd who protects us, defends us and dies for us. His will is to give us eternal life and so offers his life for our salvation. His authority is to forgive us and lead us back to the loving embrace of the Father.

In Jesus' trial, Pilate is described as a ruler who wants only to protect his career and his position. He has a chance to side with the truth and to stand up for what is right. But Pilate opts for his own self-interest. He gives in to popular demand. He compromises himself and looks for an easy way out, sacrificing principle and moral value.

In the face of death and before a worldly power, Jesus remains serene and composed. He accepts everything for our sake. He takes everything in silence and in humble submission. He lives what he has preached, "The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mk 10:45) and "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 15:13).

Liturgical Calendar Explained

The liturgical calendar is the cycle of seasons in the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church. The Church year begins each year with Advent, the season of awaiting Christ's coming, and ends with the final Saturday of Ordinary time. Within the standard calendar year, the Church year starts in early December (or sometimes the end of November) and goes through the following November.

The Church year consists of six liturgical seasons: Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time after Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time after Pentecost. Seasons begin or end based on a movable feast and so some seasons vary in length from year to year, and vary as to the calendar dates.
