

From the desk of the pastor...

A story is told when a destructive earthquake hit Turkey in December, 1988. After the earthquake, rescue teams worked frantically, hoping that some people buried under the rubble might still be alive. Eight days after the killer quake, miraculously a woman was found alive. So was her three-year-old daughter. How did the frail daughter manage to survive? Throughout the eight days, the mother repeatedly punctured her fingers, letting her child suck the blood coming from them. Through the mother's heroic act, her child survived!

The story illustrates the sacrificing love of a mother, which is a fitting testimony on Mother's Day. The story also hints at the kind of love God has for us.

Jesus says in the gospel of this 6th Sunday of Easter, "As the Father has loved Me, so I have loved you."

Though Jesus did not write a neat treatise on the kind of love He was talking about, He did indicate some of the qualities it should possess. One distinctive quality of that love is **the ability to give one's self for the good of the other**. In other words, to sacrifice for the other, as the Turkish mother showed in the above story.

But "laying down one's life for another" belongs to martyrs and heroes. They do not come often in life and it's difficult.

A young boyfriend once wrote a love letter to his girlfriend. In flowery words, he professed: "Dear Maricel, I can climb the highest mountain... swim the seven seas... fight the most ferocious lion in the jungle to prove my love for you."

Then he signed: "Your ever-loving Johnny." Right below it, he scribbled a P.S. "I'll visit you on Sunday if it will not rain!"

A writer once said: "Let us love with all our hearts and accept the unlovable side of others, for anyone can love a rose but only a great heart can include the thorns."

Update to Lockdown Measures



Below is the Information from the Bishop concerning new restrictions announced Friday April 16th for the Province of Ontario.

PETERBOROUGH, CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN DEANERIES

Effective Monday, April 19, 2021, priests may celebrate weekday Mass for a maximum of 10 people including the celebrant and liturgical ministers, if the pastor deems it safe and feasible.

There is to be no public celebration of the Sunday but Mass may be celebrated for the purpose of livestreaming with adherence to the capacity limit of ten (including the celebrant, technicians, and liturgical ministers).

- **OTHER LITURGICAL RITES:** Baptisms, weddings and funerals may proceed observing the capacity limit of 10 people.
- **HEALTH PRECAUTIONS:** All health precautions must be observed including the requirement to maintain contact tracing records.
- **STAY WITHIN YOUR REGION.** Travel outside of the jurisdiction must be curtailed unless absolutely necessary.
- VACCINATION Encourage parishioners to read the materials about the COVID-19 vaccination and to get vaccinated when they are eligible. <u>https://www.peterboroughdiocese.org/en/how-do-i-</u> find/covid-19-update.aspx


