



From the desk of the pastor...

In this weekend's gospel we hear Jesus making extraordinary demands, "Whoever loves father or mother. . . son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me" (Mt 10:37). He wants absolute and full allegiance to him, even in preference to the closest blood ties, and one's very self. No past or contemporary spiritual leader ever dared to ask for so much.


He demands an absolute allegiance which the Jews used to give to God alone.

No doubt, Jesus sets himself as the decisive factor. He is someone no other man can claim to be: he is the "Son of Man who will repay each man according to his conduct" (Mt 16:27).

That is why he also makes extraordinary promises – promises he intends to fulfill personally, for he alone has the power to do so. Identifying himself with "the least" of his disciples or any needy person, Jesus promises to reward even the tiniest sign of acceptance, respect, or help given them for his sake. No king nor kin could ever make such a promise, let alone fulfill it. Jesus does. He means what he says. And he will do what he means.

Practising detachment from everything and everybody for Christ's sake is to share in his death. Enjoying the reward he promises is to share in his Resurrection.

Now, as he did then, Jesus challenges us with his demands. He challenges us to set our priorities right. It is for us to respond, ready to lose everything else in order to find him. And in him we shall find everlasting life.



MASS INTENTIONS UPDATE FOR OUR LADY QUEEN OF PEACE & ST. ALOYSIUS

What is a 'Mass Intention'?

The tradition of Masses offered for the intentions of living or deceased loved ones originated in the very early Church and continues to be an important Catholic practice. For us who believe that the Mass is the perfect prayer, no greater gift can be offered for our loved ones, living and deceased, who may still need the help of our prayers. Priests are under a strict obligation to remember in a special way the person for whom the Mass is being offered. Masses are often requested for a loved one who has recently died or on the anniversary of a death. However, the gift of a Mass intention is also a wonderful way to offer prayers on the event of a wedding anniversary, a birthday, an anniversary of ordination or entrance into religious life. Masses may also be offered for the intentions of a person about to undergo surgery, who is recuperating from an illness, who wishes to overcome addiction, sin or has some other special need. Masses may be offered in thanksgiving for blessings, family, health and answer to prayers.

Cost of a Mass Intention

We offer announced or unannounced masses for your loved ones. According to diocesan guidelines the standard offering for an "Announced Mass" Intention is \$20.00. An "Unannounced Mass" Intention can be offered for \$10.00. Of course, no one "purchases" a Mass - no one Mass "belongs" to any one person. The Mass is offered for all. But it is permissible for a priest to celebrate the Mass for any intention. Priests can offer more than one intention at a mass on any given day. Please note that \$5 of each mass intention collected is deposited to the 'Priest Benefit Fund'.

"Announced" vs "Unannounced" Mass

An Announced Mass will be placed on a scheduled day and time and be listed in the bulletin. The intention is also mentioned in the Prayers of the Faithful during the mass.

An Unannounced Mass means the intentions are not announced, but are known to the priest and included in his celebration of the Mass. They will be mentioned in the Prayers of the Faithful on the day the intention is offered. A Mass Card can be provided indicating the intention to be celebrated and the date and time of the mass.

How to Purchase a Mass Intention

Please contact the parish office to schedule a Mass intention. Payment can be made in cash, cheque or e-transfer.
