


From the Desk of the Pastor...

The gospel message for this Sunday is about giving. Christ praises the poor widow who drops only two small coins in the coffer of the temple, unlike the others who "put in their surplus money".

The poor widow received the praise of Jesus because she put her last money, though she was poor. As Jesus said: "She gave all she had to live on." The message of Jesus is very clear: Every person is capable of sharing no matter how poor or needy he is.

Many people would give because they are pressured to do so. Others give because they do not want to be embarrassed. Some would give for the motives of honour and prestige. And not a few would give because they want to get something in return.

True giving must be sincere. It must be coming from the heart. The real value of giving is not measured by the amount given. Real giving is the generous giving of oneself – a sort of sacrifice on the part of the giver.

How do we give? 1. Give without ostentation or vain or blowing your trumpet. 2. Give willingly or not begrudgingly or under compulsion. 3. Mother Theresa's advice was to "give until it hurts."

Here's a story. Walking along a street in Russia during a famine, the great writer Leo Tolstoy met a beggar. Tolstoy searched in his pockets to look for something he could give. But there was none. He had earlier given away all his money. In his pity, he reached out, took the beggar in his arms, embraced him, kissed him on his hollow checks and said: "Don't be angry with me, my brother, I have nothing to give."

The beggar's face lit up. Tears flowed from his eyes, as he said: "But you embraced me and kissed me. You called me brother – you have given me yourself – that is a great gift."

Jubilee Year 2025 – Pilgrims of Hope

What Is a Jubilee Year?

A Jubilee Year is traditionally proclaimed by the Universal Church every 25 years. It is a particular year set aside to encourage the faithful to embark on pilgrimages, to repent of their sins and forgive the sins of others, and to renew a focus on the spiritual life. In the Hebrew tradition, as recorded in Leviticus, a Jubilee was celebrated every 50 years with the freeing of slaves and the forgiveness of debts. In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII instituted the first Christian Jubilee, and since then the Church has designated each new Jubilee as a special year of grace and forgiveness, offering the faithful an opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence.

The 2025 Jubilee will be centered on the theme "Pilgrims of Hope." As His Holiness Pope Francis so beautifully expressed it: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." The Jubilee begins on December 24, 2024, with the official Opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica, and runs to January 6, 2026, the Feast Day of Epiphany, with the Closing of the Holy Door. Preparing for the Jubilee Year

Pope Francis declared that 2024 be marked as a year dedicated to prayer in preparation for the Jubilee. Dioceses and parishes are invited to promote initiatives to remind people of the centrality of both individual prayer and community prayer. The Year of Prayer is, in the Pope's words, focused on "rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer, prayer in personal life, in the life of the Church, prayer in the world." To help mark this year more fruitfully, the Dicastery for Evangelization has released a wealth of resources, including a series of "Prayer Notebooks," which draw on the many forms of prayer found in the rich Catholic tradition. The Canadian Conference of Bishops website is also hosting a free four-part webinar series entitled "A Great Symphony of Prayer: The Our Father as a Programme of Life." The webinars and Reflection Guide "enable the faithful one meaningful way to participate in the Year of Prayer which was announced by Pope Francis on 21 January 2024" and explore the themes outlined in the Notebooks. Over on the <u>Ontario Catholic School Trustees</u> <u>Association website</u>, parents can find a wealth of educational materials to help their children and families prepare for the Jubilee year. In this year of prayer in preparation for the Jubilee, let us unite in prayer for an international outpouring of graces for belief, love and adoration of the Eucharist, to reach every Catholic, all non-believing or lapsed Catholics, and each non-Catholic!


